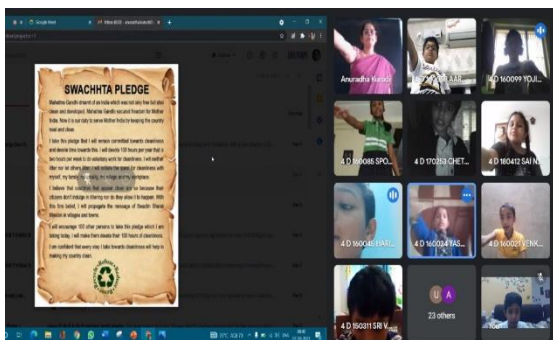
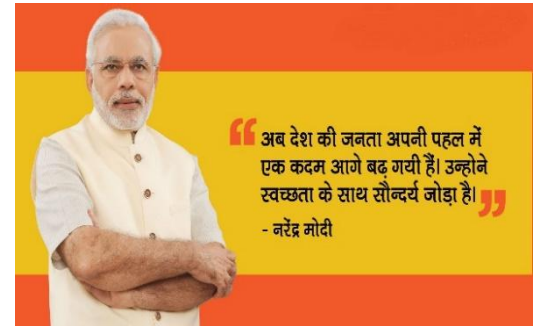

Cleanliness Drive for Swachh Bharat – Swachhata Pakhwada

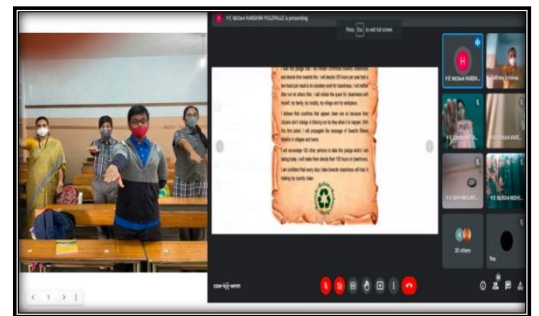

As per the initiative taken by the CBSE, the whole school unitedly participated in this drive which was a fortnight awareness program.

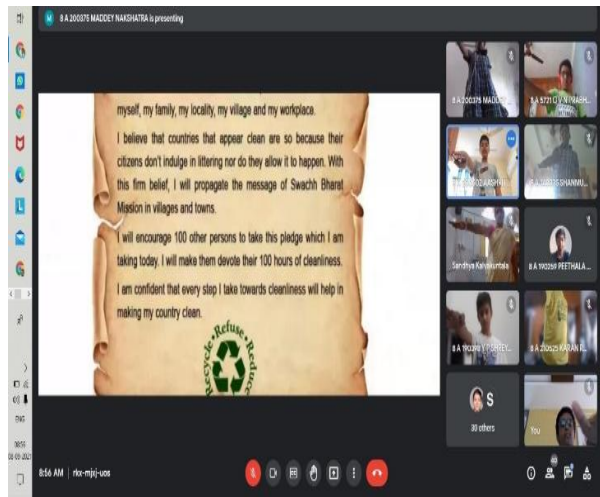
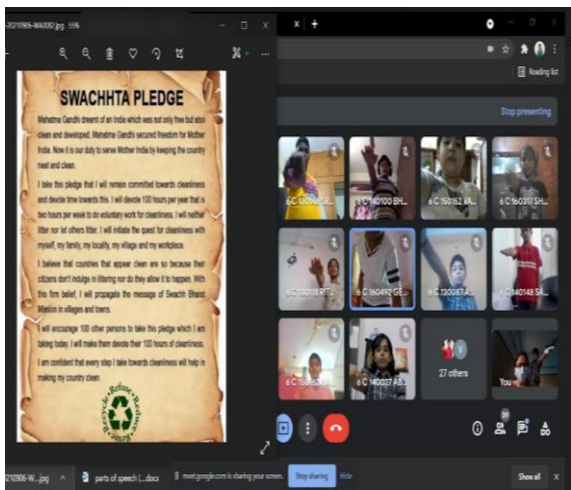
